

Speaker's Corner

MESSAGE FROM PRAVESH GUPTA

It's a great honour for me for getting invited to pen down my memoir. I come from a beautiful hamlet named Alsindi deep down in district Mandi of Himachal Pradesh. My village is surrounded by 5 hills all around and it sits at the bottom of a valley. A small rivulet runs near to my house and my primary school was just 2 jumps away on opposite bank of this rivulet. My primary schooling happened from a Government school and incidentally my aunt (my father's elder sister) was the headmistress there. She was my first formal guru who helped me to scale further heights in my life ahead. I do remember hazily that once my sister and her friend were trying to pluck some walnuts and I was shouting from a bit far for giving some of it to me, they did not hear me, in the heat of the moment I picked up a small stone and hurled at them, incidentally it flew on my sister's head and she got a minor injury. That was the naughty side of tiny me...

I grew up in a joint family, and I used to go with my grandfather to the orchard in front of my house on the hill to take care of the plants. He has almost planted all kind of fruit trees from Apple, Plums, almonds, apricots, pears etc in it. I do remember the sight in spring when the whole "baagicha" used to turn pink and white with flowers blooming in these fruit trees. In the summer, these trees used to bear lot of fruits and we used to enjoy those with my cousins. In the rainy season, the rivulet used to get filled with water. Winter season was really cold and it used to snow in the veranda in front of my house. My father had a shop in the village and my mother is a homemaker. I have one elder sister and two younger brothers who all are well settled.

Class 6th was turning point of my life when my friend said that he is giving the entrance exam of Sainik School. I filled the form at the last moment and prepared for it with the help of my aunt's husband who again was a teacher and my guru who steered my life boat in a new direction. I got selected in Sainik School Sujanpur Tira which is in district Hamirpur(H.P.).

I landed in school in the summer of 1989. School was situated on the banks of river Beas facing the "Dhouladhar ranges" of middle Himalayas . There was a big playground called "Chougan" which was historically a battle field of Raja Sansar Chand." Chougan" can hold four cricket matches simultaneously. Fort of the king was on a small hillock whose laps we used to take during Cross Country. We were the 12th batch in the school with roll numbers starting from719 to 811. I was the roll No 735 and this will remain forever with my life. We had a very disciplined, rigorous and stringent routine of waking up 5am in morning , going through the Physical training in this "chougan", classes, NCC, sports class and preps everyday. On every Saturday we used to have 6km cross country race. I learned swimming in the Pong Dam in class 8th. I do remember my first dive into 300m deep water where my coach carried me to some deep in water by holding my knicker loop and asking me to try to swim myself by moving hands. Suddenly he left the loop and then I had experience of my life. School made me a complete cadet as the main aim was to send students into "NDA". It instilled in me the "Pursuit for Excellence" and "Action speaks louder than words". My Principal Gp Capt C.M Mundepi gave us the mantra of life "Day by day in every way I am better and better".

I cleared the NDA exam and appeared for SSB at Allahabad but I could not make it. I prepared for engineering and got selected at REC Hamirpur in Civil engineering. I and my friend Naveen dropped out of college and prepared again and got REC Jaipur and REC Warangal respectively in the next attempt. RECs have now been christened NITs. At NIT Jaipur, I studied Electronics and Communication engineering and participated in Curricular activities. I was the President of Electronics and Communication Society and active in sports. I met my best friend Mayank Arya here who was pursuing "Chemical engineering". I got placed in "Siemens Electrical". In round two, HLS India came and Bandy took my interview and literally I felt I didn't know anything. I got the Field Visit call to Visit "HLS India Duliajan". I took the first flight of my life "Air Deccan" from New Delhi to Dibrugarh in Jan2001. During the field visit I had privilege of working with Bijoy Chetri, Basu Da, Raju Gurung, Silva and EIC Surya Kumar.

I joined HLSA in Aug2001 as Junior Maintenance Engineer. Here I had the opportunity to learn from my third guru "Bandy". Initially, we had our pre school at "Hyatt" at Bhikhaji Cama in New Delhi for a week. Alas that was the finest of five star treatment. "Bakre ko halal hone se pehle taiyar kiya jaa raha hai". After that, we flew to different locations. I, along with Devesh Kalia joined HLS Duliajan. We were on job back-to-back and saw 2 full suit Open-hole jobs and a fishing in the very first 15 days. I do remember that we were loading SWC and I almost fell asleep during counting of the core barrels. In this job, I had the privilege of lying down on the ground and taking a good nap as we were

I used to shuttle between Duliajan and Nazira for the initial learning. At Duliajan Silva was my mentor and at Nazira I met the great "AKA-Mr AK Ahuja". The climate was really very hot and humid at Duliajan and Nazira. Tap water used to be bit iron-rich at the location (brownish in color). I do remember that for cleaning it out, we installed sedimentation tank in Nazira B house. I worked at Nazira, Duiliajan and Agartala in the Maintenance Department. In between I had chance to go for troubleshooting a logging unit at Brahmanbaria via Akhura border in Agartala. I do remember Swami Nathan was carrying out job and one of the CRT screen monitor blew due to lightening. There was another lightening related issue where tension monitoring circuit failed due to lightening strike on the rig.

Year 2005 was the greatest time of life when I met my better half Ritu at Sarojini Nagar. I along with my brother went to see her father's house. We got married on 18th Feb2006. After marriage we flew to Duliajan. I do remember one day I was troubleshooting RMT tool overnight and the neighbor adjacent to my house D6 in Oil Duliajan Colony was kidnapped in field, though later he was released. On 26 Dec, 2006 early morning we were blessed with my lovely son Soumya at Shimla.

I was transferred to Gandhinagar in 2006 after we wound up our base at Duliajan. I along with Bed made ASP0010H XL2KG system ready overnight by working continuously for 48 hrs approx. Unit was later spooled at HLS Barmer base. I along with my wife and 1month old son were travelling along in Unit.





We established the Gandhinagar base at B25. That was the turning point in the chapters of HLSA history as we now had an Operation base for GSPC. This contract yielded us good revenues and I do remember Subhash starting the Operations and later I took the baton and we clocked approx. 700k USD with a single truck and single set of crews in one of the month. Our first RDT job of HLSA at well AB2 was also done by myself and Bed. Unit was all jam packed with the client counting more than 10 Nos and we brought Oil in very first attempt. From 2008 to 2011 I was FSQC(Field service Quality Coordinator) for North East Region.

After this role, I transferred to into the role of Performance Development Coordinator which primarily involved handling maintenance activity and learning and development of people. In 2014 we did one job of SPS which I was supervising from the Cairn Office at Gurgaon and it lasted total 72hrs. That was an awesome moment. We took total 6 samples and had failure of 4 FPS. Job was a success in the end. After that I moved into Safety role and had the worst incident that happened during that period where one of our associates lost his both hands fingers during the fishing operation. I really dread that incident. Learning from it was "Safety has to take top priority".

I moved further in life and got into "Technical Manager" and now "Country Reliability Manager" role which primarily involves taking care of learning and development activities of Field Engineers, Maintenance engineers and other field associates, helping company by designing innovative solutions an giving technical help.



During all these years, I had opportunity to make budding engineers & budding operators learn nuances of logging job and I feel proud that HLSA engineers and operators are making a mark in logging industry. By continuously interacting with all the young blood, it helps me keeping young and gives me unquenchable thirst for keep on learning in life. Life is a continuous journey, and we must keep on planting new saplings

I would sum up with a few stanzas from "Stopping by Woods on a Snowy evening" by Robert Frost:

"The woods are lovely, dark and deep, But I have promises to keep, And miles to go before I sleep, And miles to go before I sleep"
