Speaker's Corner

**Message from SANJAY KUMAR GUPTA** 

It's a great honor for me to be invited to pen down my memories. I come from a beautiful place called Dehradun (U.P) now it is (Uttaranchal Pradesh). I completed my 10+2 from SD Intercollege Saharanpur (U.P) and later on completed my graduation from Arunachal University, Namsai, Arunachal Pradesh.

My father was working in Brij Transport Saharanpur, He was earning very little salary, which was just enough to survive. I have two sisters and one brother. Brij Transport had provided us with the home and it was taken back when my father retired.

I started my wireline career journey in 1982 as a Training Equipment operator with Schlumberger Bombay and within four years I was handling an independent OH & CH unit offshore.

When I started earning a bit, I took a kaccha house in a village called Lakhan Wala, on Dehradun Road, and settled my parents there. My house was surrounded by hills from four sides, green eucalyptus trees and one small Rajbahey (Small canal) was flowing near my house, where we used to take water and play in it during vacations.

Mr. Rajeev Grover had worked in Schlumberger along with Mr. C.K. Singhal and they knew the Schlumberger Mumbai Forman who had a relationship with me. Mr. Grover called him and asked him to give him one of the reliable Crew chiefs who could help to establish a new company called Bow Services. At that time Forman told me to go and meet Mr. Rajeev Grover in Delhi. After reaching on 9th October 1986, I joined" Bow Services" on 9TH October 1986.



I was kept in Bow Services, corporate office in Qutub Hotel Delhi for two days and read some big technical manuals. On 11th of October morning myself and Mr. Grover flew to Chennai. We reached the ONGC office/Workshop at K.K. Nagar Chennai.

That time Mr. S. Madhwan was CG well, ONGC. Mr. Grover introduced me to him and said 'that Mr. Sanjay Kumar

Gupta would be Bow Service's Crew Chief and would help in ONGC's maintenance contract'.

Bow Services had a maintenance contract with ONGC at K.K. Nagar Chennai. We started servicing their equipment like G series tools, DDL-1 units, heads & Generators, etc. The tools were not opened for a long time, but we could maintain them by doing really hard work and using 36" Pipe wrench to open them. PM-1, and PM-2 were done.

Later, I was moved to the Delhi office in early 1987 for the mobilization of a new services contract with ONGC Agartala (Tripura). We had a service contract for the Rotary coring tool, Spectral Gama Ray, and Long Space Sonic. I prepared & fabricated TATA 307 equipment carrying support truck at Delhi, fabrication of small tool racks, hand tools & trolleys etc. Then drove that truck to Agartala. It took us seven days from Delhi to Agartala as there were only single roads. The logging truck belonged to ONGC, we used to run our tools & do pre jobs & post jobs of our equipment and help ONGC also.

Later on, I was moved back again in late 1987 to the Delhi office to start preparation for support truck, & mobilization for Oil India's one unit contract at Jaisalmer. I prepared everything, fabricated the support truck 1210 (bus chassis), and drove it to Jaisalmer. There was very hot weather at that time and I could see lots of dunes during traveling to Jaisalmer. That time we had nothing in Jaisalmer, not even crew. It was very hard time to do mobilization of Gearhart India's very first unit.

I & Rajiv Kapuria used to get up at 5 am every day and go to a place called Oil India ware house at Hamira and test our equipment & come back around at 11.00 PM. Hamira was a remote place and we did not have any shop, restaurant or even any shed to relax. We used to work every day in direct sun with temperature of 45 to 50 Degrees centigrade and eat biscuits & wafers at that time.





Once things started moving, we started building up a workshop, building, store, Lab, washing area (without water), etc. We had fabricated an Ashok Leyland Hippo truck 680 Model, tool racks, cabin, and frame at Ahmedabad. Once we got the truck

chassis with a tool rack from Ahmedabad, we started mounting on its first offshore unit with the help of the Deu-tech drilling company. We did the first full-fledged logging of Oil India at Ramgarh and the first job was Open hole. During the job, our Lovejoy coupling of Cummins failed, We could fix it in the direct sun at the well site only, Then our ONAN generator also failed. I had to rush to Jaisalmer and by reading its manual I could repair its rocker arms.

बहुत सारी रुकावटों के बाद, हमारा एसएफटी (सिलेक्टिव फॉर्मेशन टेस्टर) टूल अटक गया और हमें टूल Fishing करना पड़ा। टूल आने के बाद, हमें उस काम को फिर से वायरलाइन के साथ ख़त्म करना था हमारे पास एक नई केबल थी लेकिन कोई स्पूलिंग सिस्टम नहीं था। उस पूरी रात मैंने ब्रेक बेंड की मदद से एक स्पूलिंग सिस्टम तैयार किया और सुबह स्पूलिंग पूरी कर सका और फिर केबल shoe बनाए और फिर से रामगढ़ कुआं स्थल पर गया और रामगढ़ लॉगिंग पूरी की। यह गियरहार्ट इंडिया की पहली लॉगिंग थी और इसमें बहुत सारी चुनौतियाँ थीं। लेकिन आप चुनौतियों से सीखते हैं।

Then we mobilized another unit in ONGC Jaisalmer in 1989 and the unit name was 8901 and started ONGC operation with it. We had hired some more engineers, operators & mechanics at that time. 1988-1989 was a really hard time with lots of challenges. After that, things started going smooth.

The year 1990 was the greatest time of my life when I met my better half, Neha Gupta at Saharanpur and we got married on 5th May 1990. But most of the time she had to stay in Jaisalmer city alone as I was busy in operations.



I was also blessed with a son in 1991 in Jaisalmer and his first birthday party was celebrated in Jaisalmer.

I was transferred in 1993 year to Bharuch for the mobilization of units & workshops. We were awarded another contract of ONGC at Ankleswar for Production logging & OH, and we needed to mobilize without a workshop. To do the initial mobilization, we made a small tent and stored all

the equipment, ready boxes, etc. in it. Then we started operation especially OH, Production logging with MUX-GR- TEMP-FDR-SPT-QPS-FMS with Mast. A new mast was purchased from National Crane and was built up there. On Hippo truck. We had two-unit bases there named called 9301 OH & 9302 CH.







There was a tragedy with one of CC of Nazira in 1995, He was on days off and a bomb was planted under his seat in Punjab, he passed away. He was a very close friend of mine. I was transferred to Nazira as a CC. There was one unit base OH & CH, where we handled operations with EIC called Mr. D. Nath and I was posted up to 2000 there and handled OH & CH jobs there.

Then in 2001 I was transferred to Bharuch again to demobilize equipment from our base in Bharuch to Noida and set up a base at Noida. I moved to Bharuch and then shifted everything base, unit, equipment to Noida and moved to Noida along with my family and kids.

I was upgraded to Operation in-Charge and responsibility was given to do new projects Mobilization, training, development of operators, technicians recruitment & new operators recruitment. We have constructed Noida offices and workshops and started moving units to Sunder Nagar to do OH & cased hole jobs

In 2004 or 2005, we were awarded a contract in Bangladesh of TTBP and with lots of challenges we finished it.





One day I was discussing it with Mr. Grover, why don't expand HLS A and he asked me what I thought, I said that we should add another division of slick line in HLSA, and later on, I was given additional responsibilities as a special project coordinator, and we have worked for bidding for the Slick line. After getting a quote for slick line equipment and bidding to Cairn India,

we were awarded a new contract for slick lines. We hired a slick line crew as well as a slick line in-charge to run the slick line operation, we could mobilize the first contract of the slick line.

I was told by all my colleagues that I had worked in wireline in India since 1982, why don't I go internationally as I have lots of experience? I got an opportunity in Baker Abu Dhabi as a Rotator pool in 2008 and I left my position at HLSA, but out of India, there is money but no life. You have to leave as a Darpok. I was transferred to Yemen and Yemen was a disturbed area. I decided to resign from Baker Hughes and came back to India on days off. I contacted Mr. Grover again and I was taken back to HLSA in 2009 and continued my services at HLSA.

I was given more responsibility as an HSE officer, new project mobilization, Construction of GNDR base, Test well & RDT pressure testing unit, which I completed with full dignity and responsibility.

Since 2001, I have been posted at Noida and later I have been given a special project of GNDR base, test well & RDT pressure test setup. I fabricated a 7" metal casing and fiber casing at Noida and sent it to GNDR. I moved to GNDR, After completing the test well of 1000 ft with fiber casing a GR-CCL log was done and the well was locked and handed over to Subhash Jee.

After Joining back in 2009 & the assignment of safety, I made many changes and things got better with reduction in incidents. Later on, I was also given operation & mobilization support responsibility and did mob and demo from the Noida office. In 2016 oil prices were very low and my contract expired in 2016, I was released from my services.

Then I got an opportunity at WF (Kuwait) in field operation and that assignment also I completed and trained juniors and improved the process. As local rules and regulations are very strict in Kuwait, then I thought of resigning from Weather Ford. Same time I got a call from the station manager Baker Hughes India to work as a foreman in Baker Hughes in India. I accepted that position and I was posted in Agartala.

I mobilized Agartala two units, one unit at Nazira, the base set up in Agartala, Nazira. Later on, Baker Hughes got a contract with Oil Dullahan and I was sent to DLJ for the mobilization of one unit and set up workshop.

Duliajan is a remote place, As there was no social life, I thought that I should finish my wireline career and relax. I went to Vietnam for a tour and relaxation. While coming back from there I got the call from SCR that HLSA got a big contract with ONGC. HR & Operation manager (Sukhdeep Josan) asked me to come to Noida and join HLSA. I had a good experience with HLSA. I joined in 2019 as an Executive (Operation Support, Training, Development) mobilization) I did the mobilization of ONGC new units at GNDR & Mumbai (offshore).

Now I am posting at Noida. I would say thanks to HLSA for making me a part of it and allowing me to develop with the organization as well and its people. As it is a long journey of wireline there may be some error in dates but forgive me and move forward.

I would sum up with a few lines in Hindi translated at Google.
